IV. COMPETITION MECHANICS

1. Eligibility:

- Participants must be currently enrolled in any public or private secondary school under DepEd Samar, Catbalogan, or Calbayog Division.
- Dancers must be in pairs (1 male, 1 female).

2. Attire:

Costumes must be appropriate and conform to the standards of youth competitions.
 Overly revealing attire is discouraged.

3. Music:

- Music will be provided by the organizers to ensure uniform tempo and timing.
- Each dance will have a 1 to 1.5-minute performance duration.

4. Warm-up and Practice:

- · A designated area will be provided for warm-up.
- Schedule of rehearsals and final briefing will be released prior to the event.

5. Conduct and Deportment:

 Professional conduct is expected at all times. Any form of misconduct or unsportsmanlike behavior may lead to disqualification.

6. Judges' Decision:

All decisions made by the panel of judges are final and irrevocable.

V. CRITERIA FOR JUDGING

Each performance will be judged based on the following:

A. Technique - 30%

Precision, footwork, posture, and execution of steps

B. Timing and Musicality - 25%

Ability to dance in sync with the rhythm and beats of the music

C. Presentation and Style - 20%

Stage presence, charisma, expressions, and overall styling

D. Choreography and Creativity - 15%

Creativity of the routine, transitions, and originality

E. Coordination and Partnership - 10%

Chemistry, connection, and coordination between partners



3. Equipment

 Mandatory use of percussion instruments (snare, bass, tenor drums) and melodic percussion instruments (lyres). Additional instruments are subject to approval by the organizers.

4. Entry and Exit Procedures

 Bands must enter the performance area in an orderly fashion and start from a designated starting position. Upon completion, they must exit promptly to ensure a smooth flow of the competition.

5. Penalties

- Deductions will be made for the following:
- Exceeding the time limit (e.g., 1 point deduction per minute over).
- Failure to follow entry/exit procedures.
- Displaying inappropriate behavior or unsportsmanlike conduct.

6. Judging

 A panel of judges, each specializing in specific areas such as musicality, marching, and general effect, will evaluate the performances.

7. Scoring

 Judges will score based on the outlined criteria, and the scores will be averaged to determine the final score for each band. The band with the highest score will be declared the winner.

· Avoid excessive repetition of the same style, pattern, or formation.

5. Safety Protocols:

- · Dangerous moves are strictly prohibited, including:
- Tossing
- · Three-level lifts
- Aerial throws
- · Lifting is allowed up to the second level only and must be fully supported.
- No body drops or stunts that may endanger performers are allowed.

6. Costume and Props:

- Costumes should reflect authentic streetwear style.
- · Accessories such as hats, gloves, scarves, and jewelry are allowed.
- Removing articles of clothing is permitted only if appropriate, in character, and not offensive or revealing.

7. Ground Rules:

- Violation of any guideline will result to deduction of the total average score.
- All groups must adhere strictly to the rules set by the organizers.
- The decision of the Board of Judges is final and non-appealable.

DANCE SPORTS COMPETITION SECONDARY LEVEL

Category: 24 Pairs (12 pairs for Standard & 12 pairs for Latin)

I. OVERVIEW

The Dancesport Competition is one of the highlights of Tandaya Festival 2025, showcasing the elegance, discipline, and artistry of our youth through competitive ballroom dancing. The competition will feature both Standard and Latin categories.

II. PARTICIPATION STRUCTURE

The competition is open to 24 pairs from the secondary level under the following representation:

- 6 pairs for Standard Dances/6 pairs for Latin Dances from DepEd Samar Division
- 3 pairs for Standard Dances/3 pairs for Latin Dances from DepEd Catbalogan City SDO
- 3 pairs for Standard Dances/3 pairs for Latin Dances from DepEd Calbayog City SDO

And must also be officially endorsed by their respective municipality/city.

III. DANCE CATEGORIES

Each pair will compete in two dance disciplines:

A. Standard Dances

- Waltz
- 2. Tango
- 3. Viennese Waltz
- 4. Foxtrot
- 5. Quickstep

B. Latin Dances

- 1. Samba
- 2. Cha-Cha
- 3. Rumba
- 4. Paso Doble
- 5. Jive



Drum and Lyre Competition Samar Day 2025

I. Guidelines

1. Number of Participants

- Minimum: Each band must have at least 50 members.
- Maximum: Each band can have up to 100 members, including all instrumentalists, auxiliary members, and drum majors.

2. Rehearsals

Scheduled practice times will be provided prior to the competition day.
 Each band must adhere to their allocated rehearsal slots.

3. Attire

 Bands must wear uniforms that are appropriate and approved by the organizers. Uniforms should be consistent and enhance the visual appeal of the performance.

4. Conduct

 Participants are expected to maintain decorum and sportsmanship throughout the competition. Any form of misconduct, including disrespect towards judges, organizers, or other participants, will result in penalties or disqualification.

5. Registration

- Bands must register by the specified deadline. Late registrations may not be accepted.
- Registration forms must include a complete list of participants, instrument details, and any additional equipment or props intended for use.

6. Music Selection

- Theme: Performances should feature a "Touch of Samar with a Modern Twist."
- Content: Incorporate traditional Samar music and themes, creatively blended with modern musical elements.

7. Logistics

 Bands are responsible for the transportation of their instruments and equipment. The organizers will provide designated areas for assembly and preparation before the performance. SIGN

II. Criteria

1. Musicality (50%)

- Musical Arrangement (20%): Originality, creativity, and complexity of the musical pieces performed.
- Execution (20%): Accuracy in rhythm, tempo, and note precision.
- Balance and Blend (10%): Harmony among instruments, ensuring a cohesive sound.

2. Marching and Maneuvering (30%)

- Precision (10%): Accuracy in steps, alignment, and synchronization of the performers.
- Formations (10%): Creativity and complexity of the patterns and transitions.
- Timing (10%): Consistency and coordination with the music.

3. Showmanship (10%)

- Energy and Enthusiasm (5%): Performers' energy levels and engagement with the audience.
- Uniformity (3%): Consistency in appearance and presentation of the band members.
- Audience Engagement (2%): Ability to captivate and interact with the baudience.

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4b. General Effect (10%)

- Visual Impact (5%): Overall visual appeal, including costumes, props, and choreography.
- Coordination (5%): Integration of musical, visual, and marching elements for a cohesive performance.

III. Mechanics

1. Performance Duration

 Each band is allocated a performance time of 5 to 10 minutes. Exceeding this limit may result in penalties.

2. Performance Area

 The competition will take place on a specified field with clear boundaries. Participants must perform within this designated area.



STREET DANCE COMPETITION SECONDARY LEVEL

Overview

The Street Dance (genre) Competition is a celebration of Samarnon creativity and street culture—blending modern street dance with the heart and rhythm of SPOP (Samar Pop Music). This high-energy performance art showcases choreography that reflects the voice of the streets, interpreted through the vibrant sound of Samar's own music.

Let your moves echo the soul of Samar!

GENERAL GUIDELINES

1. Eligibility:

- Open to all bona fide high school students (Secondary Level) from DepEd Samar, Catbalogan City and Calbayog City Division.
- Each group must consist of a minimum of 6 and a maximum of 8 members.

2. Music and Theme:

- Groups must use SPOP (Samar Pop Music) as their official music track.
- · Music must be submitted in USB, clearly labeled with the school/group name.
- Music must be clean, free from obscene or offensive content, and suitable for public performance.

3. Performance Duration:

Routine length must be between 3 to 5 minutes.

4. Dance Styles:

- Performances should creatively incorporate a variety of authentic street dance styles, including but not limited to:
 - · Hip Hop
 - Popping
 - Locking
 - · Breakin'
 - · Waacking
 - Vogue
 - Krump
 - Stepping
 - Dancehall
 - Freestyle Choreography



EDUCATOR'S NIGHT

Festivals Prod Competition

 The competition is open to eight (8) clusters from Deped and State Universities:

CLUSTER I: Almagro, Tagapul-an, Sto. Niño, Sta. Margarita I & II

CLUSTER II: Gandara I & II, San Jorge, Matuguinao, Pagsanghan, Tarangnan

CLUSTER III: Daram I & II, Talalora, Zumarraga

CLUSTER IV: Jiabong, Motiong, Wright I & II, San Jose De Buan, Hinabangan

I & II, San Sebastian

CLUSTER V: Calbiga I & II, Villareal I & II, Pinabacdao I & II

CLUSTER VI: Sta. Rita I, II & III, Basey I & II, Marabut

CLUSTER VII: Catbalogan City Division & Samar State University (SSU)

CLUSTER VIII: Calbayog City Division & Northwest Samar State University (NwSSU)

- Each cluster shall present a specific Samar Festival, preferably one that is traditionally celebrated within their respective area.
- Each group must have a minimum of 15 and a maximum of 30 participants, including props personnel. Canned music must be used during the performance. For safety reasons, the use of fire or any flammable materials is strictly prohibited.
- 4. Educators' Night will be held on August 2, 2025, at Tandaya Hall. The program will begin at 4:00 PM. Each performance must run for a minimum of four (4) minutes and a maximum of five (5) minutes, including entrance and exit. Performances will begin immediately after the reading of the narration, which should not exceed one (1) minute.
- 5. The decision of the Board of Judges is final and irrevocable.
